Cancellation of previous Gold Coast City Council (Control of Bathing Reserve) Notice

 All previous Gold Coast City Council (Control of Bathing Reserve) Notices made pursuant to section 935(2) of the Local Government Act 1993 are hereby repealed.

Control of bathing reserves

- Under section 935 of the Local Government Act 1993, the following land and waters are placed under the management and control of the Gold Coast City Council as a bathing reserve-
 - (a) the land under the sea as delineated on Plan Number LG142, being land measured seawards for a distance of approximately but not more that 1 km beyond lowwater mark at ordinary spring tides; and
 - (b) the foreshore adjacent to the land in paragraph (a); and
 - (c) the land adjacent to the foreshore in paragraph (b), being the State land above high-water mark at ordinary spring tides that is ordinarily covered by sand or shingle; and
 - (d) the sea above each of:-
 - (i) the land in each of paragraphs (a) and (c); and
 - (ii) the foreshore in paragraph (b).

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO PREPARE A STANDARD

Notice is hereby given under the *Statutory Instruments Act 1992* section 54 that the *Transport Operations (Passenger Transport) Standard 2000* is to be remade.

Background

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (the department) is proposing to remake the *Transport Operations (Passenger Transport) Standard 2000* (the Standard) prior to its expiry on 1 September 2010. To ensure key stakeholders have the opportunity to comment, public notices inviting input will be placed in readily accessible media such as the Courier Mail, the Queensland Government's Get Involved web page at www.getinvolved.qld.gov.au and on the department's web site at www.transport.qld.gov.au

Passenger safety on public passenger vehicles is a priority for the Government. Only vehicles meeting specific safety requirements may provide a public passenger service in Queensland. Eligibility to provide these services is determined by vehicle's age; chassis, brake, suspension, steering, frame and panels; its mechanical condition; the ability to meet all applicable Australian Design Rule requirements; exhaust emissions and suitability for use on various road conditions. Passenger comfort and safety is also considered.

The proposed Standard will set out the safety, security and quality requirements operators and drivers have to meet to provide public passenger transport services. These requirements will enable the department to ensure small and large operators and drivers provide a reasonable level of public transport safety and service to public passenger transport users.

What is the Purpose of this notice?

The purpose of this notice is to seek submissions from industry, public authorities, interested groups & persons and the public on the proposal to make a new Standard to replace the *Transport Operations (Passenger Transport) Standard 2000* which expires on 1 September 2010.

What are the Objectives?

The remade Standard will meet the objectives of the *Transport Operations (Passenger Transport) Act 1994* and set out the safety, security and quality requirements operators and drivers have to achieve to provide services which meet the needs of Queensland public passenger transport users.
